Dictionary.com defines insignificance as being too small to be important. Discuss the statement “The most significant thing you can do is the insignificant thing”. Share stories of seemingly small and insignificant things others have done and how they have impacted your life for eternity.

Read 1 John 2:15-16. Discuss how the pursuit of significance in this world (desire to have, desire to feel, desire to be) robs us from the opportunity for true significance in God’s kingdom. (Obeying the great commandment and fulfilling the great commission)

Read Mark 10:42-45 and Luke 9:57-62. How does answering Christ’s call to insignificance empower us to live a life that matters?

What does it mean for you personally to “follow like you have everything to lose?” If you have made a decision to follow Christ, have you discovered the way God wants to use your “insignificance” for his Glory? In what ways are you allowing God to use you to impact the lives of others (both in and outside the church)?

Read Mark 10:21 and discuss Christ’s promise of treasures in heaven. What are the contents of your heavenly 401k? How is your portfolio doing?
